



## Welcome in Navarra (Spain) You come in south Basque country

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Just after Bentarte pass  
alt.1340 m :  
you will encounter a large  
wooden signpost with  
directions and distances. Is  
the most delicate part on this  
stage.  
Be aware of possible bad  
weather.

At N° 43 you will arrive at Izandorre shelter.

This shelter has been built in this location because this section of the trail is particularly exposed to bad weather conditions in winter, which makes it easy to lose one's bearings on several path crossing, this part of the trail requires being fit, since it ascends from starting altitude 180 m St.Jean PP to Leopoder pass alt.1410 m

## LEOPOEDER PASS

Alt.1410 m

From Lepoeder pass there are two routes :

- Left roman route GR7 more direct but very steep on the first part
- Right Ibaneta pass route GR 12 is longer but less steep

By GR 7 from Lepoeder pass it takes about 1 h to join Roncesvalles

For the same location there 3 names :

- in Basque "OREAGA"
- -in Spanish "RONCESVALLES"
- -in French "RONCEVAUX"



From Leopoder pass it is impossible to see Roncesvalles at the bottom of gorgeous beech forest, do not be worried that there !

By clear weather, you'll be able to see Ibaneta pass (right) and Burgete village in the valley (left), 3 km after Roncesvalles for the next stage.
